Why Planes Aren't Always Faster

Flights may seem quick, but airport delays, baggage waits, and out-of-town terminals often mean trains win door-to-door.

Environmental Impact Comparison

Planes emit over 5x more CO₂ than electric trains. On average: Flights = 230g CO₂/passenger/km vs Trains = 41g or less.

Comfort and Convenience

Trains offer more legroom, city-center stations, flexible booking, and fewer restrictions — no liquid bans or long check-ins.

Top High-Speed Train Routes (2025)

- Paris → London: 2h15m (Eurostar)
- Madrid → Barcelona: 2h30m (AVE)
- Berlin → Prague: 4h30m
- Milan → Zurich: 3h30m

- Apps: Trainline, Omio, Rail Planner
- Most trains now offer Wi-Fi, outlets, and quiet zones.

Eco Itinerary: 7 Days by Train

Day 1-2: Paris → Day 3: Brussels → Day 4-5: Amsterdam → Day 6-7: Cologne — All under 3h rides on high-speed lines.

When Flying Still Makes Sense

For long-distance (e.g., Spain to Greece), islands (e.g., Iceland), or remote regions with no rail access. Otherwise, train it!
